Spotlight on... DUCCS Member Melissa Burroughs Peña

We're using our Spotlight On... feature to get acquainted with current fellows, longtime DUCCS members, and more.

This month, meet DUCCS member and USCF Assistant Professor of Clinical Medicine Melissa Burroughs Peña.



Clinical interests: I currently practice general cardiology and echocardiography. I see patients with a wide spectrum of cardiovascular conditions mostly in the acute care setting.

Research interests: My research focuses on the effects of public policy on cardiovascular disease in vulnerable populations in global and US settings. My most recent work was on air pollution and cardiac structure and function in Peru. This study gave me tremendous insight into the ways in which public policy from other sectors outside of health care, including energy and urban planning, has direct effects on cardiovascular disease risk. I have also worked on projects with US cohorts such as the Hispanic Community Health Study/Study of Latinos and the Women's Health Study.

Something nobody knows about you: One of my favorite hobbies is genealogy. I recently traced the Burroughs family back to Moore County, North Carolina during the time of the American Revolution. I had no idea that we had North Carolina roots.

A question you hate being asked: Where are you from?

The story behind the photo: The picture is from last summer when I attended Monique Anderson's wedding at Duke Chapel. We had not been in Durham since we moved to California last year.
